

TransCanada laptop donation helps boost computer literacy

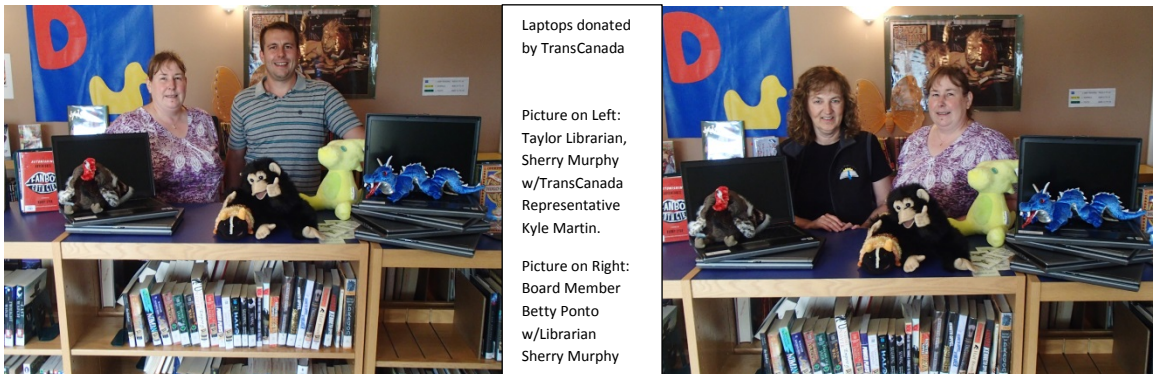
Taylor, B.C., July 15, 2014 – TransCanada has partnered with the Taylor Public Library to provide a generous donation of six refurbished laptops that will aid in furthering technology literacy in the community. The library will now be better equipped to provide hands-on training for those who need help with computer skills.

“There are many searches that cannot be performed without a computer. The need for computer literacy and a working knowledge of computers and the Internet is significant, and we are trying to meet it,” said Sherry Murphy, Librarian, Taylor Public Library.”

Technology literacy is an ongoing service that Taylor Public Library has for its community members. Library staff is always helping those who would like to learn more about computers, eReaders, and other technical devices.

“Community partnerships are important to TransCanada. This is a terrific opportunity for us to give back to the community,” said Joel Hill, project manager, Merrick Mainline Project. “We believe in supporting communities - whether it’s providing financial support, sharing resources or volunteering, we are committed to playing a role in building better communities where we live and work.”
